From the Pastor

The members so far are, from the staff: Barbette Cullen and Diane Castro, who will take turns representing the religious education program and people; Kelli McNulty, the parish manager; Bill Harding, a volunteer staff member who takes care of the chapel and brings communion to many of the shut-in parishioners. The parishioners at large are represented by: Ellen Schwab, the head of the events committee of the parish; Linda Curry, from the evangelization committee, and whose husband, Shaun, is one of the parish trustees; Jeb Stroble and Deidra Grimes, an engaged couple who will be married here this weekend; Peter Pezzelli, the chairman of the evangelization committee, who has been organizing outreach to Catholics who may be disaffected from the Church; Steve Cooper, who with his wife, Abby, have been loyal parishioners and parents of children who are altar servers. There is much more that can be said in praise of all of these faithful parishioners than space permits here.

Several other parishioners who are heads of various ministries were also invited but were unable to commit themselves at this time.
