The Giving Tree has been a tradition here at St. Francis of Assisi and St. Romuald for many years. On the first weekend of Advent a Christmas tree is placed in the back of the church and chapel. It is decorated with colorful tags. Each tag asks for a variety of gifts; it may ask for a toy for a child of a certain

age, or it may ask for a game for the family, or perhaps a gift card for the teenager in the household. You are invited to choose a tag, purchase the item and return it, unwrapped, beneath the tree the following week.

Once the gifts are returned, they are sorted by age and gender and placed on several tables in the lower church turning the hall into a Santa's workshop that rivals the one at the North Pole.

Who receives the gifts? This is the third year that St. Francis has reached out to those families who have called upon our Diocesan Office of Community Services (located in the lower church). The office services families from South County and the surrounding area who are struggling to make ends meet. Those families are contacted and asked if they have children in the home under the age of 18 and if so, do they need help with providing Christmas gifts for their children? A few people politely decline the offer but many say 'yes' and are very grateful and surprised that we called.

Next, an appointment is made to come and pick out the gifts. When the parent(s) arrive in the lower church they are invited to shop for their children.

Last year, Christmas 2013, your generosity helped provide Christmas gifts for more than 50 families, over 135 children!

So look for the Giving Tree this weekend and next. Take a tag. ... Choose a gift. ...Return it "unwrapped" by December 14th.

Know that you have helped a grateful parent and put a smile on their child's face this Christmas!
