BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND!

Last February, to kick off the Year for Liturgical and Spiritual Renewal, your parish priests set aside a weekend to teach about the various elements of Catholic worship in the context of the Mass. The response was overwhelmingly positive, and you asked us to do it again! On the weekend of November 12 and 13. all Masses at St. Francis and St. Romuald will be "Teaching Masses." In lieu of a homily, the celebrant will explain the components of the liturgy. We cannot love what we do not know, and **Teaching Mass Weekend** will provide our parish family an opportunity to renew our devotion to the Sacred Liturgy, which is at the very heart of our mission as a parish!

DIES IRAE, DIES ILLA!

On All Soul's Day, the Liturgy of the Hours (prayed daily by priests and religious) proscribes the recitation of the 13th century hymn "Dies Irae." Before the Second Vatican Council, this hymn, attributed to Thomas of Celano, was sung at every Funeral Mass and Mass for the Dead. The hymn, while severe in its presentation of the judgment, is also hopeful in Jesus' tender mercy toward sinners. Very rarely now does one have an opportunity to hear the chant and reflect on its meaning, although settings of the hymn were once popularized by great composers like Mozart and Verdi. On Wednesday. November 2, the traditional chant will be sung immediately before our 7PM Mass of Remembrance. The English text will be provided. The age-old hymn is a true lesson in sin, death, judgment and eternal life. It is an element of our rich liturgical and spiritual patrimony!
