LONGING TO RETURN: LENT WRAP-UP

Throughout this Lenten season, as a parish family we have reflected on the theme "Longing to Return." We have "returned" to the Lord over the past five weeks of Lent in a number of ways. We have studied scripture more intently, we have prayed the Stations of the Cross both in

our parish church and in area nursing homes, we have gathered with members of other Christian communities to pray and hear God's Word, we have celebrated the sacrament of penance, we have learned more about our rich Catholic heritage through our Dumb Ox book club, we have studied forms of art that lead to spiritual renewal, we have even gathered together to break bread and enjoy a homemade bowl of soup! It has been a busy Lent! Hopefully, through the power of God's grace, each of us in our own way has "returned" to Christ, hoping to encounter him anew in the community of the Church. As we enter into Holy Week and approach the three most sacred days of the year, we realize that our longing to return to paradise is a longing that would remain unfulfilled if it weren't for the tree of life, the cross, on which Jesus was nailed. Through the cross he conquered sin and death, opening for us the path back to paradise. As we are about to conclude our Lenten journey on Holy Thursday, consider these words from the Eastern Liturgy: "In Paradise of old, the tree stripped me bare, for by the eating of its fruit, the enemy brought in death. But now the most holy tree of the Cross that clothes all with the garment of life has been set up on earth, and all the world is filled with boundless joy!"

PASCHAL TRÌDUM

The various ceremonies of the Sacred Triduum constitute one

single liturgy, which is the heart of the liturgical year. The liturgy of the three days celebrates the greatest mysteries of redemption, and through the outpouring of the sacraments, not only do we remember what the Lord did for us, we actually experience it anew. In the liturgies of the Triduum, the Church remembers the Passion, death and Resurrection of the Lord Jesus. But although these liturgies are full of drama and a powerful sense of history, liturgical remembering is not about the past per se; it is about the present! When the Church remembers, something happens in the here and now! "Recalling thus the mysteries of redemption, the Church opens to the faithful the riches of the Lord's powers and merits, so that these are in some way made present in every age in order that the faithful may lay hold on them and be filled with saving grace" (Sacrosanctum Concilium, sec. 102). May you too be left speechless by the wonder of these holiest days of the liturgical year! Please join us on each night of the Sacred Triduum to be immersed more deeply into the Paschal Mystery!

HOLY WEEK

Holy Week is the climax of the entire liturgical year. Palm Sunday marks the beginning of the Holy Week, when we commemorate Christ's royal entry into Jerusalem. On Monday evening, our parish priests will gather with the Most Reverend



Bishop at the Cathedral of SS. Peter and Paul in Providence to participate in the CHRISM MASS. During this special mass, all of the priests of our diocese will renew their priestly promises before the bishop and will receive the newly blessed oils for use throughout the coming year (the Oil of Catechumens, the Oil of the Sick, and the Oil of Sacred Chrism). On Holy Thursday, Lent ends and the Sacred Triduum begins. The Sacred Triduum, the three sacred days marking the final events of our Lord's earthly life, forms the core of Holy Week. On Holy Thursday evening, we will celebrate the MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER at 7:00PM in St. Francis This special Mass commemorates the Church. institution of the Holy Eucharist and the Ministerial At this Mass, a ceremony of foot-Priesthood. washing is celebrated, in remembrance of Christ's own act of service at the Last Supper. At the conclusion of the Mass, the Blessed Sacrament is carried in solemn procession to the "repository" which is located in Helen Bouchard Hall, where adoration will continue until 11:00PM. Meanwhile, the altar is stripped of its appointments, as a remembrance of Christ's being stripped of his garments. On Good Friday, we recall with great solemnity the death of Jesus on the cross. Stations of the Cross will be held at 3:00PM. This is the only day of the year that Mass is not celebrated! The CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S PASSION will take place at 7:00PM in St. Francis Church. This distinctive service, which is *not* a mass, contains the familiar veneration of the cross and the distribution of Holy Communion. On Holy Saturday, the most sacred night of the year, we will gather at 7:30PM in Saint Francis Church for the **EASTER VIGIL**, the mother of all vigils, when we watch for Christ's resurrection. This mass begins in total darkness with the blessing of the Easter Fire and the lighting of the Easter Candle. We hear several readings, retelling us the story of our salvation and the mighty power of God's work in the course of the world's history. Our RCIA candidates who have been preparing throughout the past year will receive the Sacraments of Initiation and all present will renew their baptismal vows. Please make every effort to attend these sacred services of the Triduum. Without them, we would not be who we are!
