INQUIRY NIGHT AND ADULT CONFIRMATION

Do you know someone who might be interested in becoming a Catholic? Perhaps you have a relative or friend who has inquired about the Catholic faith and possibly has questions about what the requirements are to become a Catholic. Or maybe you know someone who was baptized a Catholic as a child, but never followed through with other sacraments and now, as an adult, is more interested in having faith as a part of their life.

If you know anyone who fits this description, please tell them about the **Inquiry Night** being held here at St. Francis Church on **Monday evening, September 19th at 7:00 PM** in the parish office building. This informal gathering will provide the opportunity to ask questions and get information about becoming a Catholic. We will give a short presentation on *The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults* (RCIA), a program of classes and activities to prepare participants to be received into the Catholic Church at Easter. Our parish RCIA program is led by Deacon Paul Iacono who, over the years, has proven to be an excellent teacher and guide for those preparing for reception into the Church.

There are no doubt men and women in our community waiting for an invitation to join the Church. You can assist in the Evangelizing mission of the Church by extending that invitation. If the person you invite is hesitant or shy about coming to the meeting alone, feel free to join them and support them in the inquiry. Assure them that there are no obligations, just useful information.

In a similar vein, if you are adult who was raised Catholic but never received the sacrament of Confirmation and would now like to be Confirmed, please express your interest to Deacon Iacono or to one of the parish priests. In the next few weeks as we organize the RCIA program we will also be making provision for a program of preparation for adult Confirmation. It's never too late to seek Confirmation and it can be a great opportunity to renew and strengthen your faith and participation in the Church.

BIBLE STUDY: SECOND CORINTHIANS

We will be continuing our bible study series with the Second Epistle of Saint Paul to the Corinthians. Whether you are a newcomer or an old hand at bible study, you will find Saint Paul's Epistles stimulating and spiritually rewarding. The class will be offered on Tuesdays from 7:00 to 8:30 PM in Fr. Greenan Center, starting on **Tuesday, September 13th**, followed by 10 sessions. Principal course materials will include your own Bible, the Ignatius Catholic Study Bible for Second Corinthians by Scott Hahn, the Catechism of the Catholic Church, both provided by St. Francis of Assisi, and special resources as needed. As in earlier studies of Mark's Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles, we will be emphasizing the rich language of the epistle as presented with dramatic readings by Max McClean on DVD. But, as in the past, we will allot much of our time to both small group and full group discussion of the readings. Be sure to register early. IN SPIRIT AND TRUTH THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

In today's gospel passage from the eighteenth chapter of Matthew, Jesus reminds us that wherever two or three are gathered in his name, he is there in the midst of them. The heart and center of liturgical prayer is none other than Jesus himself. It is Jesus who initiates and sustains our prayer to the Father in the liturgy. For many years, a vision of liturgy that emphasized our own prerogatives and activity in the liturgy held sway, but is now giving way to a different perspective, which is deeply rooted in the liturgical vision of the Second Vatican Council. The liturgy is principally about Christ's work, not ours. The liturgy in its essence, is not what we do, but what *God* does! Pope Paul VI made this point abundantly clear when he announced the proclamation of the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy of the Second Vatican Council. In the liturgy, he taught, "the post of honor is reserved to God" and "as first duty we are called to raise our prayers to God." "The sacred liturgy," he continued, "is the primary source of this divine exchange in which *the life of God is communicated to us*." The liturgy is ultimately, God's initiative, not our own. It is the point of contact where God reaches out to bestow upon us something we cannot fabricate ourselves, a share in his own divine life. The most important work of liturgy is done by God, not by us! If we are to accept the challenge of the Second Vatican Council, we should be willing to approach liturgy not as performers but as humble recipients of divine grace.

THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NEW TRANSLATION OF THE ROMAN MISSAL

While we are still twelve weeks away from the full implementation of the new translation of the Roman Missal, you will notice some changes to the *sung* musical settings at Mass. At their most recent general meeting, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops voted to permit the early implementation of the sung revised translations beginning in September (this includes the "Holy, Holy, Holy" and the "Mystery of Faith," which is sung immediately after the consecration). We have been practicing the new settings before Mass and will begin to use them *during* Mass beginning in September. The remainder of the newly translated Missal will be implemented, according to the original plan, on November 27, 2011. As we make more significant strides in implementing the new translation, we appreciate your patience. Change is never easy! Nonetheless, the Celebration of Mass is absolutely central to our faith and our mission as a parish, and hopefully this time of transition will allow us to grow in our knowledge and our love of the Church's greatest prayer.
