

From the Pastor

This morning (Tuesday) I spent four hours in the emergency room of South County Hospital, sure that I had appendicitis. I didn't. In fact none of the tests showed anything particularly wrong. So I escaped again. But my mind was whirling with how we'd cover everything, even just through Sunday: a funeral on Friday, a wedding rehearsal at St. Rom's at 1 on Saturday, speaking at all the Masses this weekend, an Eagle Court of Honor on Sunday at 2, a wedding at 4. It's best not to worry about things that haven't happened, but I couldn't help trying to come up with alterative plans if I should have had to have surgery.

It makes this Commitment Sunday even more real and important. We need everyone to jump in financially and in volunteering their time to enkindle the fire of Faith, Hope and Love to ensure the continuity and growth of this Christian community.

Many blessings on all who are able and willing to increase their giving to allow us to go forward and flourish. Blessings too on all who are able and willing to volunteer their time and talent at the sign-ups on the second and third weekends of October.

As for those who are unable to do either, please add your prayers for a new impetus of commitment among those who can.
