From the Pastor

Around 50 years ago, the name of one of the sacraments was changed from Extreme Unction to the Anointing of the Sick. This marked a turn from an understanding of that sacrament as a forgiveness of sin in preparation for death to a more ancient theology of a prayer for the strength and health of those facing serious illness. I do not mean that it can't be used for the dying, and in fact it is most commonly used when a person is in his or her But the "Last Rites" of the Church are really confession, the renewal of baptismal vows and Viaticum, a kind of "last communion," literally "food for the journey," which may in fact be given any number of times before one becomes incapable of receiving any longer. It seems assumed by the ritual books of the Roman rite that the Anointing of the Sick should be given at the beginning of a debilitating or long-term illness or before surgery. The patient would then be sustained by the regular reception of the Eucharist. Viaticum, as mentioned above, would then be part of the Last Rites

I'd like to urge everyone to call the priest, or even approach us after Mass, for the Anointing of the Sick at the onset of any serious illness or before any serious surgery. The prayers of the rite ask for strength and health and this is how it's best used: not as a final anointing before death but a prayer of faith for life and health.


