From the Pastor

First let me express my thanks to Christina Moynihan, Rita Newcomb, Kathleen Lindvall and Karen Koza, who organized and ran our recent Family Olympics after the 4:30 Mass. The evening concluded with a chicken and pasta dinner and Deacon Patrick Moynihan spear-headed the clean-up afterward, a true servant. You may have seen the article on this event in the August 24th issue of the Narragansett Times.

Last week's "Better Part" on Wednesday evening was attended by over 50 people. Sr. Pia Meehan, a native of our parish, was the guest speaker, and by a wonderful providence, another parishioner, Deacon Stephen Battey, was on hand to close the evening with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Once again, thanks especially to Sr. Pia and Deacon Battey, and of course to Christina, Mark and Diane Castro, Bill Harding, and Jackie Haigh for the work they put into this event.

I wish that space and time allowed me to write more about these two events and thank more adequately all those who organized and attended to the details of these efforts. But the Better Part evening does lead me to the subject of how blessed our parish is with vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

Now another of our parish community has been called to give her life to Christ as a cloistered religious. As has been announced in the bulletin, Kelli McNulty, our parish manager, is leaving us after 25 years of service and has been officially accepted as a postulant in the monastery of the Sisters of the Visitation of Holy Mary in Tyringham, Massachusetts. Kelli was first hired by the then-pastor, Fr. Robert Allaire, 25 years ago to be secretary and bookkeeper. A dozen or so years ago, she was promoted to the position of parish manager and over these many years she has served the parish with great devotion, fielding all the telephone calls, assisting all who have come to our doors. Over and above her duties as secretary and receptionist, it's been Kelli's unenviable duty to do all the bookkeeping, attend to all the federal, state, municipal and diocesan bureaucracy, and adapt herself to the personalities of four different pastors and a host of assistant pastors and priest-residents.

In order to wish her a fond farewell and express our thanks for her faithful service, a reception will be held after each of the Masses (8, 10 and noon) next Sunday in the Helen Bouchard Hall beneath the church, to which all the priests who have served here over the years have also been invited. (Kelli has a wedding to attend on Saturday, so we were not able to host a reception for her after the 4:30 Mass that evening.)

Kelli's last official day as a parish employee will be September 21, but our new secretary will assume her position this coming Tuesday, September 6, about whom more next week.

Also, remember to spread the word that next weekend we return to the "winter" schedule: 4:30, 8, 10, and noon in the church; 10 a.m. in the chapel.


