From the Pastor...

This weekend's second collection is our **"Ongoing Maintenance"** collection. You may well wonder where the money goes. Although all of our parish buildings have been updated or renovated in the past ten years, we always have needs that arise and, as you know from your experience in your own homes, repairs are costly and in larger buildings the cost is even greater. I thought I would tell you about some of the bigger expenses that we have had recently.

During the spring and early summer we had a couple of problems with the heat/AC system in the church. First an electronic control had to be replaced and later a leaking valve in the air conditioning unit had to be replaced necessitating a recharge of the system. These repairs cost a total of \$5,404.

Other recent expenses have been in the rectory. When the new addition was built and the rectory was renovated about ten years ago, nothing was done to the old steam oil heating system. Radiators throughout the residence had electronic valves to regulate the heat, but the valves were beginning to fail and are no longer available for replacement. The system was noisy (think clanging pipes and pounding radiators), often in need of repair and it was generally very inefficient. With the approval of the finance council, we sought bids to replace the system and over the summer Atlantic Control Systems has installed a new gas-fired forced hot air system. The high-efficiency equipment and the conversion to gas should provide ongoing savings while the zoning arrangement should make the heat more manageable and comfortable. We have also converted from an oil hot water heater to a gas, high-efficiency tankless system. While they were zoning the heat, we were also able to make the air conditioning more efficient as well. We still are not fully operational because we are waiting for National Grid to install a new gas line, but that should be done soon. The total cost of this project was about \$30,000, but we are expecting rebates from National Grid as well as ongoing savings that will help us in the long run.

Another rectory issue was the windows. The residence side of the building is very old and over the years there has been some settling, resulting in slanting floors and crooked window frames. The windows that were installed ten years ago may have been good at the time, but were very drafty today. The finance council agreed that it would be pointless to invest in an efficient heating system if the windows are not tight, so we have installed efficient new windows at a cost of about \$18,000.

The next project will be better lighting in the parking lot behind the church. We are presently working with a lighting contractor and I hope that by winter we will have new lights to make the property more secure and safer for all who participate in our many parish activities. We are also getting bids to do some patchwork in the parking lot and reseal the surface.

Not to forget the chapel in Matunuck, earlier in the summer we had the building washed to remove mildew caused by the dampness and since then a high-quality sealer has been applied. The cost for this project was quite low thanks to some very generous volunteers. Also at the chapel, one of the furnaces has failed, so we are presently seeking bids to replace.

Maintenance is an ongoing concern. The "Maintenance Collection" paid for part of these improvements and fortunately we had some generous bequests that helped to pay the balance. We have fine parish facilities and it is important that we maintain them properly. Your ongoing support is essential and I work closely with the finance council to ensure that the funds entrusted to us are used carefully. Thanks again for your presence and generosity!


FAMILY LITURGY: **Open the Door of Faith**


