From the Pastor,

As we begin a new liturgical year, I can finally get around to last year's financial report, included in this week's bulletin. The insert is a bare summary: the actual report is 17 pages long, plus a 3-page one for the cemetery. These reports cover the fiscal year from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018.

As you can see, thanks to the loyal support of many of you, our income from weekend collections was up \$9,000 compared to the year before. Our investments did well and you can see an increase of just over \$4,000. Of course, this depends on how the stock market is doing.

We were blessed also in our expenses. I'm sorry that I cannot break things down more specifically for you. For example, the parish office building and the rectory share the same boiler, air-conditioning system, electrical meters, etc. So I can't tell how much electricity is used by me in the rectory and how much is used by the staff in the office. This condensed report also doesn't show how much of "church" expenses include salaries; obviously, my salary is not included in the \$22,000 for "rectory" expenses.

In any case, for the last fiscal year, our income exceeded our expenses enough to put something aside for the proverbial rainy day.

In the present fiscal year, we have had several "rainy days." We needed a complete new air-conditioning/heating system in the lower church that cost approximately \$27,000 and at the chapel, we've had to replace a burner in the heating system, and the organ needed repairs: we went two weekends without it. Sooner or later, the air-conditioning compressor for the upper church will have to be replaced. But we'll worry about that when the day comes. In the meantime, we continue to try to keep expenses down.

May the Lord bless all of you who continue to support the parish financially and who give a percentage of your income as a thank-offering to Him.
