

UNDER HER BLUE MANTLE (By MARYANN GENSLER)

I once read somewhere that every pregnancy is a miracle that fills us with awe, joy, and dread at the same time. A few weeks ago, a friend of mine gave birth to a long-anticipated, beautiful, and healthy baby boy. Full of gratitude for the gift of her son, she was deeply scandalized when just a few days after their arrival home she found herself overwhelmed with sadness. I remember well having the same experience after the birth of each of my childrenespecially my firstborn son. Several times a day I would sit rocking and nursing him, weeping uncontrollably. Witnessing this, my husband asked me what was wrong. Through my tears, I expressed to him that my sadness brought forth the awareness that I would be unable to meet the needs of the life that was entrusted to us and that his destiny did not belong to us.

Certainly our Lady must have experienced this. Looking down at that dear beautiful baby, she knew: he was flesh and blood and he would suffer. She could comfort him, but she could not take away his pain. There were times when-like all babies-he would cry inconsolably, and she would too. There is nothing that she has not felt, touched, heard, or experienced-other than sin-like any other mother in history. So, it is with this confidence that we can all stand in front of her, and under her blue mantle. Our Lady of Consolation, pray for us.
