From the Pastor,

By this weekend (I'm writing this on Monday morning) work on the parking at the chapel should at least have begun, and, weather permitting, even have been completed. I say "weather permitting" because right now it's raining cats and dogs.

As I'm sure you recall, I have outlined in this column how the work on the interior of the church will begin on the day after Easter and is scheduled to take no more, and we hope less, than eight weeks. During that time, we shall probably have to hold funerals at the chapel so as not to keep interrupting the work in the church, but we shall certainly not have to cancel weekend or morning Masses during that time.

Now we're embarking on Holy Week, not a pageant based on events of the past but a making present sacramentally the power of those saving events which are indeed historical but also realities in which we are now involved. From the Lord's entry into Jerusalem, through his Last Supper, his agony in the garden, his trial and condemnation, his suffering and death, his descent into hell, and finally his glorious resurrection, the liturgy of Holy Week celebrates the continued presence among us of the Lord our Savior. I urge everyone who can to make time to be with us for these sacred liturgies.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY


