

SEPTEMBER 1, 2019

From the Pastor,

Last Sunday I went to a celebration of priestly anniversaries at the Portuguese club in East Providence. It's been 30 years for Fr. Joe Santos, the pastor of Holy Name parish in Providence. Although he is from Bristol, R.I., he was ordained for the Archdiocese of Braga in northern Portugal and returned to the States to help his aging father. On Saturday evenings in this parish there is the usual Mass that attracts the older parishioners; at 9 on Sundays, the African-American community gospel choir provides the music; at 11 a.m. there is a Latin high Mass in the pre-Vatican II form; and finally the African immigrant community has Mass at—as they put it—at 12:30, or 12:40, or 12:45.

This African community is served by a young priest from Nigeria, Father Lazarus, who lives at Holy Name. He just got his master's degree at Providence College and is now going to going to Boston College for further studies; he was celebrating his 12th anniversary at Sunday's dinner.

Finally, Fr. John Wydeven, a former military chaplain who has been serving as the Catholic chaplain at the Veterans' Hospital for many years, was celebrating his 40^{th} anniversary. He was ordained a bit later in life and so is getting into his later 70's, but still working full-time and living at Holy Name.

At my table, the priest next to me is from Westerly and is a pastor in Providence. He had to leave early since he has duty at RI Hospital one day a week and had been up all night with emergency calls. The priest next to him is also a pastor in Providence and came to RI from Guatemala. Next to him was the pastor the Portuguese parish in Bristol who came to us from Canada but is a native of Brazil. Next to him was a fellow member of the community he belongs to and who is from Milan, Italy. I found out that he serves also in a parish in Trentino which is right next to the parish my greatgrandmother came from. Next to him was a priest from Pawtucket, who is the pastor of two parishes in northern RI, and next to him was the retired pastor of the largest Portuguese parish in our diocese, who came here from serving in East Timor when it was still part of Indonesia, but who came originally from the Azores. Finally, next to me was a priest from Binghamton, NY, who is now a priest in the diocese of Fall River.

The food was Portuguese, the music West African, the attendees from all over the earth. Behold the face of Catholicism!
