

From the Pastor,

Well, the work on the interior of the church is pretty much finished; it remains only to tweak the lighting, especially over the altar and across the step at the head of the aisle. It would be nice to have the lights on dimmer switches because now we're able to darken the church for special events only by turning off some of the lights. We'll see what can be done in that direction.

Of course, all this work cost money and thanks to the generosity of nearly 300 households of the parish we have been able to reap the success of the Grateful for God's Providence campaign of the diocese. As you know, 40% of the goal of \$626,000 and 60% of the \$200,000 we raised over goal will return to the parish. If you have not had a chance to participate in this effort, it's not too late. Please contact me for further information.

This raises the issue of support for the parish. Each month, I am asked to give permission to have anywhere from \$50,000 to \$60,000 transferred from savings to checking so that we can pay our bills. A cursory glance at the bulletin will show that we don't get enough on the weekends to cover our expenses. Thanks be to God that we have some money in endowments from which we can draw some of the interest. The fact remains that only around 300 households (out of 1700) give through the budget envelopes or through on-line giving. The majority of people registered as parishioners give pretty much nothing. (By the way, the fees for Religious Education cover only about 25% of that particular program.)

Sooner or later, we Catholics of New England are going to have to decide whether we want a local parish or not. If you do, then please do your part to make it financially feasible. The equivalent of one hour's wage for every 40 hours of work would be one quarter of what everyone is obliged by the law of God to give to charity from one's means. When you plan your financial giving for the year, please do not forget your parish. God bless all who do their part to continue the work begun here in South Kingstown 1879!



Our conference has now provided financial assistance to over 40 families. In visiting families in person and listening to their difficulties, we attempt to provide hope as well as compassion and aid. We recently assisted two homeless families who had been sleeping in their cars. One family with two young children needed financial assistance to be able to travel to the home of a family member in another state where a job was available. The other family of three with teenaged and adult disabled sons was helped to obtain temporary housing while awaiting more permanent shelter. We have been advised by other community agencies that we will see an increase in homelessness with current insufficient affordable housing and shelter. Rent and car repair assistance continue to be frequent requests. We helped restore electrical power after a shut off and prevented a family's stored belongings from being auctioned.

An associate member could attend meetings and help with fund raising projects or home visits with an experienced member depending on your availability.
