

From the Pastor,

Easter Monday is a holiday in most traditionally Catholic countries. In Italy it's called la Pasquetta, Little Easter. I the pre-Vatican II Mass, the gospel for today was of the two disciples who meet the risen Christ on the road to Emmaus, and Palestinian Catholics always held picnics at Emmaus to celebrate that event. In Ireland, it's also celebrated as Independence Day since it was on Easter Monday of 1916 that a band of revolutionaries took over the Central Post Office in Dublin and declared an independent Irish republic. Although the insurrection was extremely small, had little support from the public, and was quickly quashed by the British, the subsequent executions of the participants inflamed Irish public opinion against British rule and led to the creation of the Irish Free State and ultimately to the Republic of Ireland. Easter was as late as possible that year, April 23; so the takeover of the post office was actually on April 24. Still, Easter Monday, no matter what the date, is always Independence Day in Ireland and my predecessor Fr. Nick Smith, of Drogheda in County Louth/County Meath, always gave the staff the day off. This is no longer an option since the office has been officially closed since the beginning of the shutdown and most of the staff long for the day when things open up again.

Thanks to all who tuned in to watch the Holy Week service. We'll continue to livestream the weekday morning Masses. Thanks, too, to all who have been able to keep up their financial support of the parish and to make their annual pledges to Catholic Charities. God help those who are out of work! Let's continue to pray for those who are ill, for those who care for them, and for the speedy passing of this crisis. And let's all do our part not to expose ourselves and others to this virus. Mary, Health of the Sick and Comforter of the Afflicted, pray for us!

Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business.

We are consumed by distractions and do not listen to the voice that calls us to the feast.We are now home together with very little on our calendar. This gives us time to reflect on who we truly are as a family.

Busyness can no longer be the excuse that we use to skip out on family prayer and meals together or meaningful conversations with each other. Christ is calling us higher.

While we are not currently making home visits, we continue to receive

calls and determine need through phone interviews. Our focus has been responding to emergencies arising from the COVID 19 pandemic–food, car gas and medications.

Our members have been meeting through Zoom online conferences and adapting our procedures and policies to the COVID 19 crisis.

Our conference has purchased material for fellow Vincentian and spiritual advisor, Sister Marilyn Bergt, to use for making masks. She has coordinated with parishioners and community members to make cloth masks for local medical facilities.

Some recent cases included a client who requested help with a special phone to communicate with a hearing-impaired spouse in a nursing home with restricted visitors. A conference member worked with the home's social worker and activities director to facilitate a call once a day. We have provided several families with food gift cards and assisted a family who had recently relocated due to domestic violence. They needed food assistance as well as basic supplies for their apartment which had been left behind in the urgency of their move. Members donated towels, sheets, blankets, pots and pans, and cleaning supplies. This client thanked our organization for "the overwhelming kindness. We never expected to feel so welcome to a new community and will pay it forward when we are able." Another client commented that the SVDP visitors were "such kind, caring people and a shining example of the people of their Church."

We gratefully pass on these expressions of gratitude on to you–our generous donors. Thank you for supporting us in this most gratifying work for our neighbors in need.
