

From the Pastor,

At this writing (Monday morning, May 18)), we are waiting to hear if we can proceed with opening the churches for public worship for a limited congregation, who will have to preserve social distancing and be masked. I don't know why retail stores can be open under the same limitations but churches cannot. In any case, when we get the go-ahead, our plan is to have an 8 a.m. Mass at the chapel and a 9:30 at the church every Sunday until such time as we can resume the full schedule. At this juncture, we have no guarantee that we'll be able to implement the full schedule at all this summer. Still, let's hope and pray for the best. In any case, when we open the churches at all, those who are elderly or who have underlying conditions are strongly urged not to endanger themselves or others by attending. As soon as I get any clarification from the diocese, it'll be put on our website. In the meantime, if you're worried about getting to Mass, remember that the bishop has dispensed everyone from the obligation until this crisis has passed.

Also, Mass is lived streamed every day on our Facebook page (Stfranciswakefield) and then transferred to our parish website (stfranciswakefield.com); the same with May devotions, which will run daily through the end of the month.

Monday is Memorial Day, the traditional opening of the summer season (and summer prices!). Although this year will be different, it's a good time to remember the real meaning of the day: a time to honor those who gave their lives in military service. By extension, it's also a time to remember all our beloved dead. In our Catholic tradition, we remember the dead at every Mass and at Evening Prayer (Vespers), and we remember them not just in our minds but *to God* in prayer. It's also a day to pray for our country and especially for the blessing of peace.

MOTHER'S DAY ROSES SALE

Our St. Vincent de Paul Society is delighted to report that the roses project was an overwhelming success! We were moved and honored by the extent of support and help we received from our parishioners and community. On Friday, May 8th members and volunteers assembled 134 bouquets of a dozen assorted roses. Special arrangements were made to bring roses to Elderwood Nursing Home to be distributed by staff. Many of our purchasers donated money to be designated for these flowers. Bouquets of roses were included for the nursing stations with thank you posters to all the health care workers. On Saturday, a team of 11 volunteer drivers delivered roses to over 60 homes throughout South Kingstown and Narragansett, as well as Jamestown, Westerly, Exeter and North Kingstown. The total amount raised was \$5,717.00! Several donors had paid for the cost of the flowers so 100% of these proceeds will go toward assisting our neighbors with the economic effects of this pandemic. One of our members commented that "God is giving us the means to help His children in need." Thank you to all who assisted and especially those who generously purchased flowers. A special note of gratitude to Father Bodah whose support and announcements after online Masses were a critical component of this project's success.
