



From the Pastor,

As we celebrate Pentecost, Trinity Sunday and Corpus Christi at this time of the year, I am reluctant to use the homily to comment on serious flaws in our national character. So let me continue here a theme from last week.

Our country is (once again) being confronted by its systemic racism, invisible to many people who don't belong to racial minorities. We are rightly frightened and appalled by outbursts of violence and destruction of property, which is so counterproductive to the stated goals of peaceful protesters, and as usual the call goes up for angry people to limit themselves to peaceful protest. But let's remember that Martin Luther King limited himself and his followers to peaceful protest and was assassinated for his pains. Professional football players recently engaged in peaceful protests and were pilloried by much of the public and the football league. Peaceful protesters in Washington, D.C. were driven away by the police to clear the way for a presidential photo op later condemned by both the Catholic and Episcopal bishops.

I must admit that I am puzzled by those who are deaf, dumb and blind to racism and the lousy deal given to racial minorities and are outraged by property damage or anything that calls attention to the underlying problem of injustice. I know I shouldn't be: the same thing happens to preachers who call attention to the sins of any congregation. Cardinal Newman, now St. John Henry Newman, the great 19th century English convert to Catholicism, said, when he was a young Anglican priest, "Men say we carry things too far when we carry them home to themselves," and that principle remains true in human interactions. (I will say in praise of the Catholic laity that they really don't like hearing even other people's sins condemned if the preacher is always harping on the subject. Still, we all have to face unpleasant truths about ourselves, don't we?)

In any case, let's try to do what we can to support the drive to end racism and other forms of injustice and to call those in power to repentance and a change of behavior toward those whom they are called to protect and defend. We are supposed to be "one nation, under God, with liberty and justice for all."




