



From the Pastor,

The moral teachings of the Catholic Church extend to every facet of human life. There are teachings on proper medical care, on the moral use of military force, on just labor relations, on the right to unionize and to go on strike if necessary, on the restraint of the greed of laissez-faire capitalism, on the unacceptability of Communism, on the restraint of retributive justice (for example, the non-use of capital punishment), on distributive justice (that every human being has a right to the goods of the earth: food, clean water, shelter, access to health care), on proper race relations, on care for the Earth. There are also teachings on conjugal and sexual morality, on the utter immorality of abortion, on the proper regulation or limitation of conceptions in a marriage.

I have long reminded would-be converts that sooner or later, everyone finds something in Catholic teaching to object to. Sooner or later, some teaching or other is going to interfere with something I want to do. Cafeteria Catholicism is most people's way of life. They accept the teachings they like and ignore or even reject those they don't: "What does the Church know about running a business? About conducting a war? About the law and just punishments? Medical procedures? What do celibate popes know about married life?"

The political parties are divided between which teachings they accord with and which they don't. In our own country we have really only two parties to choose from and neither one embraces the fullness of Catholic teaching. The voter is left to make a prudential decision. Some will decide that one or another teaching is more important than all the others combined; others are free, according to the official decision of the Holy See, to choose a candidate who holds to the most teachings. The only caveat of the Holy See is that it would be immoral for Catholics to vote for a candidate only *because* he or she favors abortion. It would not be immoral to vote for a pro-choice candidate if in other ways he or she reflects more faithfully the bulk of other Catholic teachings. Some people don't like this. As far as I know the Congregation of the Doctrine of the Faith has not changed this decision that was made when Cardinal Ratzinger was in charge. He is still alive as Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI; those who reject his teaching may write to him directly to express their dissent from the teaching of the Holy See. As for me, I'll stick with Rome.
