





This week's sanctuary lamp at St. Francis Church burns in memory of Michael Dufficy.


## SECOND COLLECTION THIS WEEKEND: SEMINARIANS' EDUCATION

#### SISTERS OF DIVINE PROVIDENCE

On September 29, 1851, the Sisters of Divine Providence were founded in Mainz, Germany by the local bishop, William Emmanuel von Ketteler. Ordained bishop in 1850, he could see the many needs of the people of his diocese. Bishop Ketteler preached and wrote about the many social issues of his time, seeking justice for the workers and help for the poor and was very generous in providing resources to aid the spirituality of the people and to address their practical needs. He became known as the "social justice" bishop, and was a forerunner of the Catholic Church's social justice encyclicals.

Bishop Ketteler quickly realized he needed others to collaborate with him in order to serve the people's needs, especially the needs of young girls for education and of the poorest people for basic health care. Deciding to found a religious congregation of women and seeking a suitable leader for this new group, he invited Stephanie Amelia de la Roche, an educated noble woman of French descent and a recent convert to Catholicism, to join him in founding the new community. Beginning with just four women, the community grew and spread throughout the diocese.

In June, 1876, the first six Sisters were sent to the U.S. to serve the many German immigrants by teaching, pastoral care and nursing. The Sisters eventually settled in Pittsburgh, Penn., and from there spread to the Midwest and South, as well as to Puerto Rico and New England, while the Sisters from Germany began ministry in Rome. In the early 1960's the community responded to the church's call to go to mission lands, welcoming the first Korean women to the community and establishing a foundation in South Korea. At the same time, the Sisters in Germany responded to the needs of the poor by establishing a foundation in Peru. In more recent decades, houses were also established among the people in the Dominican Republic and in Poland.

In 1960, Sister Marilyn Bergt and I entered the community in Pittsburgh and began our formation as Sisters of Divine Providence. Today we celebrate lives lived fully for 60 years and pray to deepen our commitments to living our vows in community and in service to others. --Sr. Maria Fest, CDP
