



From the Pastor,

This morning, Tuesday, the Mass was live-streamed using our new system for the first time. (As you will see in the next paragraph, I wrote this column yesterday saying that I wasn't sure we'd have the new system ready for the weekend and now I'm rushing to rewrite this first paragraph to reflect the new reality and get it sent out to the printers on time.) Many thanks to our computer guy, Ron Gladski of Projex Consulting, who designed and built the system over the course of many hours and weeks. God bless our parishioners whose input was invaluable and who are still involved in the details of making everything run smoothly: Mark Castro's knowledge of our sound system was extraordinary and invaluable; Ryan Bernard, who offered his time and talent to live-stream the Masses for the last 9 months, was of monumental help in collaborating with Ron to tweak the system into shape. I would not have known even the questions to ask without these guys.

Because I wrote this column on Mondays so that the bulletin can be sent to the printers on time, I cannot comment on the Inauguration, which is scheduled for Wednesday. I'm still praying that things go smoothly and free from violence, not only in DC but in the state capitals and cities as well. On January 6, the sight of marauders attacking our capitol, vandalizing federal property and threatening our democratically elected officials of whatever party with assault and even death, certainly crystallized for many of us what this country is up against. The fact that these vandals were chanting "USA, USA" as they sought to impede the confirmation of an election they didn't like but which had been certified by local and federal officials of both parties, should scare us into a sober evaluation of the political and cultural situation in our nation today. Are we committed to having a democratic republic, or will we overturn the rule of law for the sake of certain political or cultural ends? I could have much more to say about what brought us to this unprecedented outrage, but as they say: "Least said, soonest mended." God bless and save the USA!

Discuss ways that your family can answer God's call to follow Jesus and bring the Good News to the people you meet.


