

From the Pastor,

Several items:

- ◆ Lent is coming up on February 17. This year, we cannot distribute ashes in the usual way, i.e. by rubbing a cross on the foreheads of the recipients. We are obliged to say the formula (either "Repent and believe the gospel" or "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return") only once over the whole congregation. The ashes are then distributed individually in the way already customary in Europe, viz., by sprinkling them on the top of the head of each person. The minister of ashes will therefore not touch the recipient. Those who do not want ashes sprinkled on their heads can remain in their seats. The same readings and prayers are said in any case. Masses will be at 7 a.m. and 6:30 p.m.; there will also be a service of the readings and prayers with distribution of ashes, but without Mass, at noon. Since there are no religious education classes in common on Wednesday afternoons, we will not have the usual service at 4:15 p.m.
- ◆ Stations of the Cross, led by either myself or Deacon John Dowd, will be held in the parish church every Friday of Lent. Jim DeLuca is also organized a service of Stations at St. Romuald's Chapel every Wednesday. He wants to know whether people would prefer this at 12:30 or at 4:30. Please let him know as soon as possible by emailing him at JDucaJR@verizon.net
- ♦ The annual parish mission this year will be led by the newly-retired pastor of St. Bernard's in Wickford, Fr. John Unsworth, who served as a deacon in this parish in the summer of 1975 before returning to Louvain to complete his studies for the priesthood. His theme will be "Lent as a Pilgrimage." Because we are restricted this year from making physical journeys to places of pilgrimage, can we reimagine Lent in terms of a spiritual pilgrimage, a grace-filled movement toward an encounter with the Holy? Fr. Unsworth, will preach at all the Masses on the weekend of March 6-7. He will preach at live-streamed Mass at 7 p.m. on the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of that week and will be available for confessions each evening from 6-6:45. Mark your calendars!
